

WILL / WON'T: TALKING ABOUT FUTURE.**Talking About Future Decisions:**

In daily conversations, we use “will” and “won’t” to quickly talk about future actions, promises, or predictions. These forms are perfect for making decisions, offering to help, or predicting what might happen. Let’s take a look at how we can use “will” and “won’t” effectively.

Using "Will" and "Won't"

“Will” is used to express actions in the future. When we decide to do something immediately, we use “will” to express that decision. On the other hand, “won't” is the negative form of “will” and is used to say that we won’t do something.

Examples:

- I **will call** you as soon as possible.
→ Here, the speaker has just decided to call and expresses it immediately.
- I **will drink** something.
→ The speaker has quickly decided to get a drink and shares it in the moment.
- I **won't be** late.
→ The speaker promises not to be late.

Forms of "Will": Affirmative, Negative, and Interrogative

Form	Structure	Example Sentence
Affirmative	Subject + will + Verb (V1)	I will call you tomorrow.
Negative	Subject + will not (won't) + Verb (V1)	I won't be late.
Interrogative	Will + Subject + Verb (V1)?	Will you help me?

Explanation of Forms:

- **Affirmative (Positive):** The speaker says they will do something in the future.
 - Example: "I **will go** to the park."
- **Negative:** The speaker says they will not do something in the future. Use “will not” or the short form “won’t” to make it negative.
 - Example: "I **won't forget** your birthday."
- **Interrogative (Question):** To ask a question, start with “will” at the beginning of the sentence. Answers are usually “Yes, I will” or “No, I won’t.”
 - Example: "**Will** you **join** us for dinner?"

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Common Phrases with "Will" and "Won't"

We often use “will” and “won’t” with phrases to make our statements sound softer and more polite. These phrases are also helpful when giving encouragement or making predictions:

- I think
- I’m sure
- I hope
- I guess
- I suppose
- I believe
- Probably

Examples:

- I’m sure you will pass the exam.
- I hope you will get well soon.
- I guess she will be at home in an hour.
- He will probably help people in need.

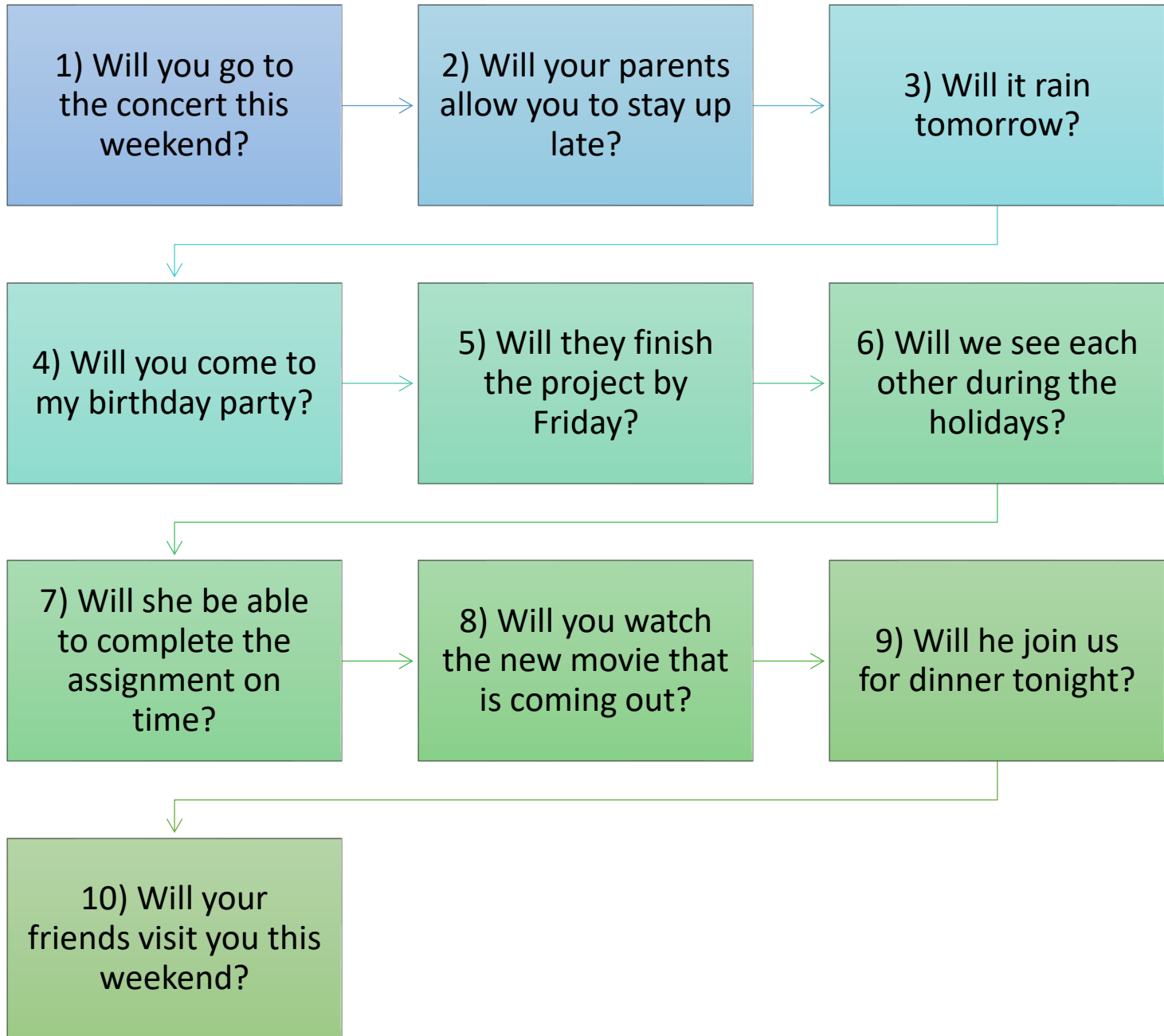
A: Will you go to the concert this weekend?
