Speaking: MAKE A QUICK DECISION!

Instructions: Person A reads the scenario. Person B responds with their decision and briefly explains their choice. Try to keep it realistic!

Example 1:

Person A: Hey, I just heard there's a *[scenario]*. What would you do?

Person B: Hmm... I think I would *[state decision]*. I choose this because...

Person A: Oh, interesting choice! Why did you decide on that?

Person B: Well, because... *[give brief reason]*

Example 2:

Person A: Hey, I just heard there's a surprise party tonight, but I know you planned to study. What would you do?

Person B: Hmm... I think I would go to the party. I can study tomorrow instead.

Example 3:

Person A: So, imagine this: there's a *[scenario]*. What would you do?

Person B: Hmm, let me think... I think I'd *[state decision]*.

Person A: Really? Why would you choose that?

Person B: Well, it's because *[give a reason]*. But it was a tough choice because...

Person A: I see. I think I might have chosen differently, but your choice makes sense!

Example 4:

Person A: So, imagine this: your teacher offers extra help after school, but you were planning to hang out with friends. What would you do?

Person B: Hmm, I think I'd take the extra help. I need it for the exam.

Person A: Really? Why would you choose that?

Person B: Well, I don't want to fall behind in class. But it's a tough choice because I also want to spend time with my friends.

- Did you change your mind while explaining your choice?
- Can you think of other ways to respond in a similar situation?
